2	 Funding Update AHP's finance team has completed initial budget reviews, is awaiting budget revisions from some centers, and then will move on to issuing contract modifications over the next few weeks. Santa Clara County requested a written statement that the funding will continue after June 30, 2025, as their board will not approve hiring for permanent positions otherwise. DHCS indicated they can provide the requested written statement for all CA 988 Crisis Centers, subject to budget approval, and also mentioned 	Brett Hall

	that there is known and certain ongoing AB988 and SAMHSA funding. StarVista requested guidance on January spending. Because centers are in different places in terms of the progress of their revised budget approvals, by 1/23, AHP will send each center a status update and estimated timeline for contract modification.
